Special Collection for Our Lady of Walsingham



Next Sunday we are keeping the feast of Our Lady of Walsingham, patroness of the Ordinariate, a day early. If the weather is clement we shall end the 9:15am and 11am Mass with a procession and benediction. If not we shall simply hold benediction at the end of Mass. Either way it will be a day of rejoicing!

The Sunday closest to the feast of Our Lady of Walsingham has been nominated for a special second collection, by the Ordinariate governing body, in aid of the Clergy relief fund. Please bring a gift to offer. It is desperately needed in order to secure our future.

Priests do not receive a pension but depend on charitable relief funds run by whichever diocese they are incardinated into. Recently the Archdiocese of Southwark raised some two million pounds to boost its own scheme, tied to property investments in London, but it has been made clear that Ordinariate clergy, even if they work full time within diocesan settings, are not eligible for help.

The Ordinariate must therefore set up its own relief fund if priests like myself are to receive anything in retirement. Please give generously to help the Ordinariate meet its obligation to sick and retired priests. Might you leave a gift in your will?
