The Presentation of Christ



Simeon, the old man who was told he would not die until he had seen the Saviour, represents the Old Testament covenant of God with his people. Once Christ enters into this world it is able to pass away for a new and exciting era has begun. The Messianic age begins and the Kingdom of God is finally at hand. The prophetess Anna, in contrast, represents the Christian age, the New Testament, she does not pass away but is led by the Spirit to worship God with the fullness of her being. The feast also reminds us that God calls us by faith to follow him. There was nothing physically different about Jesus to mark him out from all the other babies taken into the temple and presented at the altar. It was grace which revealed to Simeon that this child, the infant Christ, was the redeemer he was prophesied to encounter. It was because his heart was open to God that he achieved the sanctification necessary to see God in the ordinary things of this life. The same is true for all who follow the Lord. For example at Mass we who believe kneel in adoration before the living Sacrament; we believe that Jesus is truly present. We believe by faith that the bread and wine have become the body and blood of Christ. But to the faithless it is only symbolic. God ever veils himself from sight because he wants us to freely choose him by faith. Pray that God would grant you eyes of faith to see things as they really are. A truth that is sometimes made clear by the extraordinary Eucharistic miracles that have taken place in history. In the end we are called to believe and trust. Ask that God grants to you the necessary eyes of faith to see this world as it really is, to view things from a heavenly perspective. It is not something you can learn it is a gift granted to those who draw near to him by faith.
